Social media refers to online platforms and applications that allow users to create, share, and nteract with content, as well as communicate with others. These platforms facilitate social networking, content sharing such as text, images, videos), and discussions among individuals or groups. Common examples include Facebook, instagram, Twitter (now N, TikTok, and Linkadin. Social media can be used for personal, professional, and business purposes, fostering both realtime communication and long-term engagement.

Social media began in the late 1990s with platforms like Six Degrees (1997), which allowed users to create profiles and connect with others. Early internet communication tools like Usenet and 885 in the 1990s latel the groundwork, but the 2000s sax wither fixe of modern social with the launch of MySpace (2003), Linkedin (2003), and Facebook (2004). These platforms expanded the concept oscial networking, followed by YouTube (2005), Twitter (2006), and Instagram (2010), transformin social interaction and content sharings workflower.


